

NCAS CAREERS Weather Camp Instructor Position Description July 2017

Scope of Responsibilities:

The NCAS CAREERS Weather Camp Instructor is responsible for supporting the overall operation of the two-week weather Camp program at Howard University. The Weather Camp Instructor receives instruction from the NCAS Director and/or NCAS Outreach Coordinator for the implementation of program plans and overseeing students in a variety of settings. The Instructor will also direct and deliver a variety of educational activities. Working collaboratively within a team environment, the Instructor will report directly to the Outreach Coordinator at NCAS.

THREE (3) - FOUR (4) WEEKS COMMITMENT - JULY 09TH - 21ST CAMP DATES

Competencies Required

The NCAS CAREERS Camp Instructor shall have the following competencies:

- (a) The ability to supervise high school-aged students in a variety of settings; or
- (b) The ability to supervise middle school-aged students in a variety of settings;
- (c) The ability to treat all students in a respectful, responsible and fair manner;
- (d) The ability to demonstrate appropriate responses to student-initiated interactions;
- (e) The ability to demonstrate fair and sound judgment when coping with conflict situations;
- (f) The ability to take direction from supervisors;
- (g) The ability to work effectively as part of a team;
- (h) The ability to apply knowledge and experience of health and safety requirements;
- (i) The ability to work and communicate effectively within the academic institutional community of the given camp site, including parents, staff, school staff and students; and
- (j) The ability to apply knowledge, experience and commitment in the areas of ethnic, cross cultural, and racial understanding, as well as human rights and diversity;

Qualifications:

- (a) Experience in a teaching, camp or recreational setting;
- (b) Valid First Aid/CPR certification or willingness to obtain training is strongly preferred;
- (c) Experience as a professional in atmospheric sciences is strongly preferred.

(d) Physical abilities consistent with requirements of the job that may include personal and physical care.

Qualifications: continued

(e) Must enjoy working with pre-teenagers/teenagers.

(f) Degree in Physical Science or combination of degree with five (5) years' experience, working with pre-teens/teens in instructional settings.

Specific Job Components:

The CAREERS Weather Camp Instructor shall perform tasks as assigned by the Outreach Coordinator.

These tasks may vary, from time to time, with the evolution of the organization and include but not be limited to the following:

(a) Organize structured, educational activities inside, and outside the classroom;

(b) Guide the development of final project activities, and ensures alignment with CAREERS Camp overarching theme.

(c) Provides instruction to camp participants in basic meteorology, atmospheric, and related earth sciences.

(d) Ability to transfer knowledge and skills and assists campers in achieving activity or lesson goals.

(e) Conducts hands-on laboratory experiments and demonstrations that reinforce key concepts in atmospheric sciences.

(f) Oversees the implementation of the survey, blogging, and reporting for the camp.

(g) Generates a summary report on the camp activities, incorporating student and chaperone evaluations.

(h) Report incidents and accidents through established forms and procedures;

(i) Attend and participate in staff meetings and training sessions as required;

(k) Supervise students to ensure a safe environment;

(l) Provide feedback on his/her observations of students to the Outreach Coordinator;

(m) Supervise the Assistant Instructors and Chaperones;

(n) Other duties as required.
